

## IFFC CASTING DAY

Casting a fly with a fly rod is the most basic of skills in the sport of fly fishing – if we can't cast a fly and more important, cast it proficiently, then our enjoyment of the sport will certainly be limited. As Peter Hayes, the well known Tasmanian guide and FFF (Federation of Fly Fishers) Certified Master Casting Instructor states, "Life is too Short to be a Bad Caster".

The objective of the club's casting day then is to provide members with the opportunity to either learn how to cast a fly rod, or assist them to improve their ability in order to become more skilled and proficient.

The Club's casting day is held once per month on the Sunday immediately following the Club meeting, between 9am and 11am from February to November inclusive.

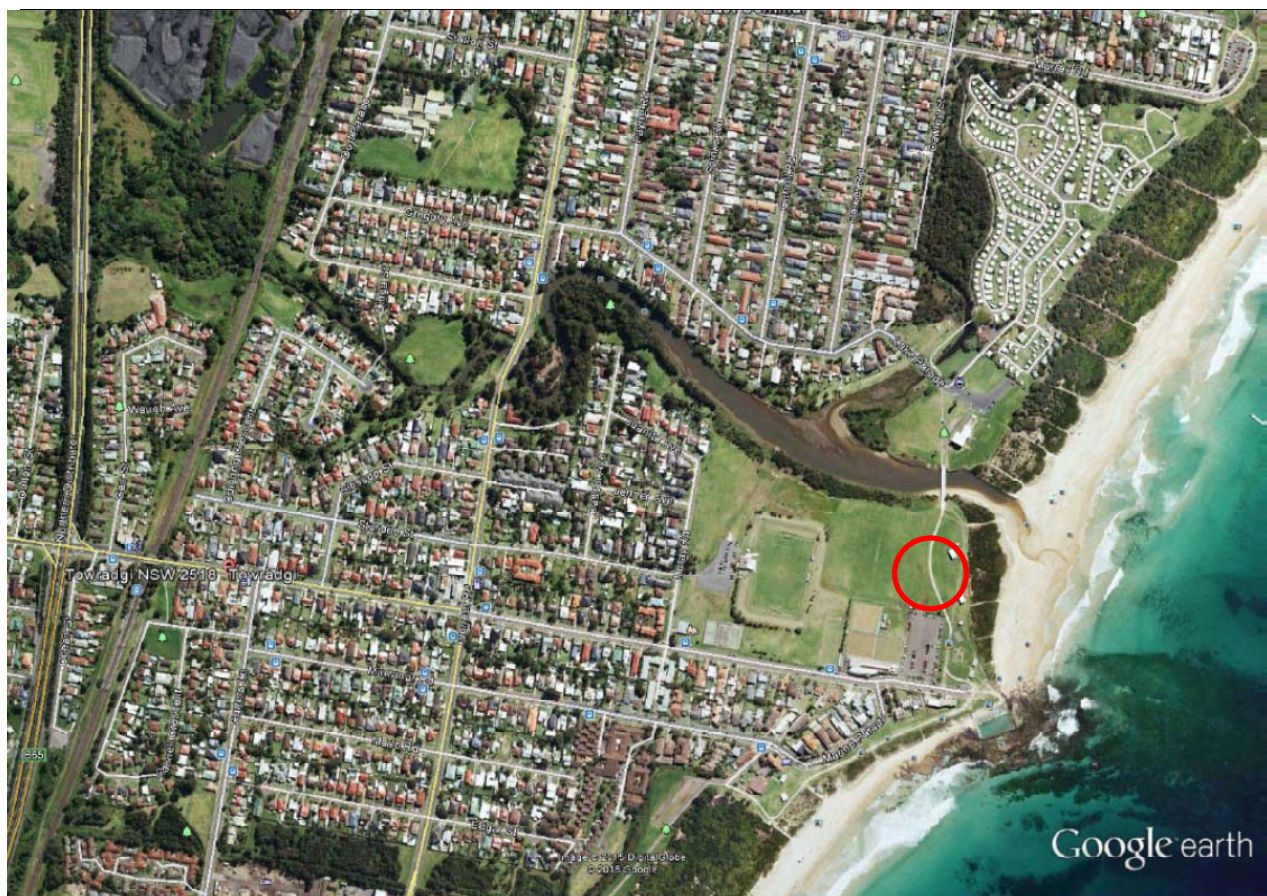
Casting is held at Towradgi Park, at the very (Eastern) end of Towradgi Road and at the Northern end of the carpark adjacent to Towradgi Bowling Club.

Directions are as follows:

Turn into Towradgi Road, either from the Princes Highway or from Memorial Drive (formerly the Northern Distributor);

Proceed East (seaward) until the Towradgi Bowling Club is reached; proceed past the Bowling Club and turn left into the Council carpark immediately East of the Club.

Proceed to the Northern (far) end of the carpark and park near the brick changing rooms - this is the meeting point before we move onto the oval.
